Discipline-Specific Electives (DSE) are designed to provide students with an opportunity to pursue an in-depth study of a particular subject or discipline and develop competency in their chosen area.</p> <p>ii. To be eligible for the award of a specialization, a learner must acquire 12 credits in the discipline-specific electives of a particular specialization. Upon completing the three-year BBA degree, students will have the opportunity to obtain a single specialization (Preferably 4 credits from Sem 5 courses and 8 credits from Sem 6 courses). However, those who choose to continue for a fourth year will have the opportunity to obtain an additional specialization(Preferably 4 credits from Sem 5 courses and 8 credits from Sem 7 courses).</p>	<p>6. i. Discipline-Specific Electives (DSE) are designed to provide students with an opportunity to pursue an in-depth study of a particular subject or discipline and develop competency in their chosen area.</p> <p>ii. To be eligible for the award of a specialization, a learner must acquire 12 credits from the discipline-specific elective courses offered under a particular specialization. Upon successful completion of the three-year BBA Degree Programme, a learner shall have the opportunity to obtain a single specialization, preferably by completing three 4-credit courses from the fifth and/or sixth semesters. However, learners who opt to continue to the fourth year shall have the opportunity to obtain an additional specialization, preferably by completing one 4-credit course from the fifth or sixth semester and two 4-credit courses from the seventh and/or eighth semesters.</p>

Nil	<p>xxx) Malpractice in Theory and Practical Examinations</p> <p>(e) In the case of students against whom malpractice has been reported and who are consequently suspended from appearing for the examinations in the coming</p>

	<p>semesters as a disciplinary action, such students shall not be permitted to register for the examinations during the period of disciplinary action arising from the malpractice case.</p> <p>However, the Continuous Comprehensive Assessment (CCA) marks of such students for the respective semesters may be permitted to be submitted to the University, provided that they are otherwise eligible for examination registration, including by availing condonation.</p> <p>(f) Students whose Continuous Comprehensive Assessment (CCA) marks have been submitted to the University for the respective semesters, and who are otherwise eligible for examination registration for those semesters, shall be permitted to register for the examinations subsequently as supplementary candidates upon completion of the period of suspension imposed in connection with the malpractice case.</p>
Nil	<p>xxxii) Learners who obtain a college change by transfer shall submit an affidavit stating that the examination centre for any examinations, including improvement or supplementary examinations, pertaining to the courses of the previous semesters, shall remain at the previous college. However, the learner shall be permitted to appear for the previous semester examinations, including improvement and supplementary examinations, at the new college.</p> <p>In the case of odd semester examinations, if qualified faculty members are available in the concerned discipline at the new college, the answer scripts shall be evaluated at the new college itself. If qualified faculty members are not available, the valuation of answer scripts shall be carried out by qualified faculty members from any other college affiliated to Mahatma Gandhi University, in accordance with the</p>

directions issued by the University.

In the case of supplementary practical examinations, if the necessary laboratory facilities and eligible faculty members are available at the new college, the practical examinations shall be conducted at the new college itself. Otherwise, the learner shall appear for the supplementary practical examinations at the previous college or at any other college affiliated to Mahatma Gandhi University, as directed by the University.
