<u>ORDER</u>

The Mahatma Gandhi University Under Graduate Programmes (Honours) Regulations, 2024, MGU - UGP (Honours) have been approved, vide paper read as (1) above, for the commencement of Four Year Under Graduate Programmes from the academic year 2024 - 2025 in the affiliated colleges of the university in accordance with the guidelines of UGC and KSHEC. Amendments to the same have been approved and University orders vide paper read as (2) and (3) above were issued.

Among the various committees constituted for the smooth implementation of the Four Year Under Graduate Programmes, the Subcommittee on Rules and Regulations after detailed deliberations, submitted recommendations, vide paper read as (4) above, to amend the MGU - UGP (Honours) Regulations, 2024. (Recommendations are attached as Annexure.)

Considering the urgency of the matter, sanction has been accorded by the Vice Chancellor, in exercise of the powers of the Academic Council vested upon him under Section 10(17), Chapter III of the Mahatma Gandhi University Act 1985, vide paper read as (5) above, to approve the recommendations for amendments.

xxx) Signature Courses: Signature courses are the specialized Discipline Specific Elective courses or skill enhancement/value addition courses designed and offered by the regular/ ad hoc/ visiting/ emeritus/ adjunct faculty member of a particular college with the prior recommendation of the BoS and the approval of Academic Council of the University/Institute.	xxx) Signature Courses: Signature courses are specialized courses classified under Discipline Specific Elective (DSE) Courses, Discipline Specific Capstone Elective (DCE) Courses, Skill Enhancement Courses (SEC), or Value Addition Courses (VAC). These are designed and offered by regular, ad hoc, visiting, emeritus, or adjunct faculty members of a particular college, with the prior recommendation of the Board of Studies (BoS) and the approval of the Academic

xviii) Multi-Disciplinary Courses (MDC) shall be so designed as to enable the students to broaden their intellectual experience by understanding the conceptual foundations of Science, Social Sciences, Humanities, and Liberal Arts. Students shall not be eligible to take the MDC in the same discipline that they have studied during their +2. Third semester MDC can be Kerala specific content. Each BoS can prepare basket of courses under MDC.	xviii) Multi-Disciplinary Courses (MDC) shall be so designed as to enable the students to broaden their intellectual experience by understanding the conceptual foundations of Science, Social Sciences, Humanities, and Liberal Arts. Students shall not be permitted to take the MDC in all three semesters in the same discipline as studied under Part III during their Plus Two education, and MDC selection must also comply with the exclusion list published by the university. This shall be the sole condition for eligibility for MDC course selection. Third semester MDC can be Kerala specific content. Each BoS can prepare basket of courses under MDC in first and second semesters. In the third semester, the MDC will be offered only by the faculty of the language departments.		
Nil	xlv) Discipline Specific Elective (DSE) courses in the major discipline may be arranged as one course in Semester III, one course in Semester IV, three courses in Semester V, and two courses in Semester VI. For the minor discipline, under Pathway Option 2, one course can be offered in either Semester V or VI. Under Pathway Option 3, for the second major, one course can be offered in each of Semesters V and VI.
