# From the Vice Chancellor's Desk

Mahatma Gandhi University, one of the major affiliating universities in Kerala, is the premier educational institution that strives to fulfil the higher educational needs of the people of Central Kerala. Its headquarters is at Priyadarshini Hills, 13 kms off Kottayam and the campus is spread in an area of 110 acres. The University also has satellite campuses in parts of Kottayam and the neighbouring districts. The University was established on 2 October 1983 and has jurisdiction over the revenue districts of Kottayam, Ernakulam, Idukki and parts of Pathanamthitta and Alappuzha. Its academic universe consists of 18 University Schools/Departments, 8 Inter-University Centres, 10 Inter School Centres and 264 Affiliated Colleges. The University has achieved tremendous progress in securing a good number of research and extension projects under the auspices of national agencies and institutions like UGC, FIST, DRS, ISRO, COSIT, CSIR, DAAD, STEC, ICMR, BARC, MoEF, ICCR, ICHR, IED, IIFT, and the Sahitya Academy. There is considerable advance made in the University's execution of MoUs with research institutions of international reputation. The MoUs entered into with Max Planck Institute of Technology, Germany; Brown University, USA; University of Nantes, France; California Institute of Technology, USA; University of Toronto, Canada; Catholic University, Belgium; Heidelberg University, Germany; and the Institute of Political Studies, Rennes, France, and Jinan University, China are only a few of them. The School of Chemical Sciences and the Centre for Nanoscience and Nanotechnology, which have been active in sending researchers to foreign Universities, have sent the largest number of researchers during the last two years. The number of researchers who visited the University under their MoUs is the highest too. The University is top in the state in bringing the **highest amount of money** by way of project grants in the year 2011 and subsequent years. A major portion of the funds are being brought by the science departments alone.

The **web-enabled University Library** with its large collection of books, journals and e-journals as well as the **Online Thesis Digital Library** that provides open access to its collection of digitalised Ph.D dissertations are some of the notable achievements of the University during the last few years. This is the only University in the country which has

made its Doctoral Dissertations Open Source for Worldwide Access. INTUTE has identified the University as the best in the country in putting its knowledge share as Open Source. This has earned the University the **Best Institution of E-Learning Facility Award** instituted by the state Government. Recently, the entry of the University's Publications Department to **knowledge book publishing**, the rejuvenation of various **Chairs in the University Departments**, initiation of the **Campus Area Networking**, development of **ICT supported teaching** (through smart classrooms) etc., have enabled Mahatma Gandhi University to assert and rearticulate its primary function as an important knowledge service provider in the country.

The achievements outlined here have placed the University quite prominently on the national academic map. Today Mahatma Gandhi University is ranked first in the State, third in South India and thirteenth in the whole nation by CSIR in terms of the intellectual productivity of the faculty. NISTADS has ranked the University nineteenth in terms of the h-Index of the Science Faculty. Some of the members of the faculty have very good publications in their areas of specialisation.

PURSE in the Country. The University has successfully introduced the Choice Based Credit and Semester System (CBCSS) and Grading System in the affiliated colleges and the Kerala State Higher Education Council (KSHEC) cites this as constituting a Model for other Universities in the state. Ours is the only University with software autonomy for computer automation and Campus Area Networking, and the only affiliating University in the Country with a Centralized Admission Procedure (CAP) for admission to both UG and PG Programmes. UGC cites Mahatma Gandhi University as a national model for New Initiatives. The University is top in bringing Nobel Laureates as Scholars-in-Residence under the Government-sponsored Scheme of ERUDITE. The University has undertaken state level co-ordination of two scholarship schemes introduced by the Government of Kerala, the ACQUIRE and Tanma for nurturing social science brilliance and literary talent respectively.

University has secured the **prestigious Chancellor's Award for the best University** in the State for the years **2016 and 2018**. Similarly, University has **obtained 'A' Grade with CGPA 3.24** in the third cycle of NAAC reaccreditation which is highest among the Universities in the State. University has also improved its position from 34<sup>th</sup> rank in 2018 to **30<sup>th</sup> position in 2019 in the NIRF ranking** of the Human Resources Development

Ministry. The University is ranked 6<sup>th</sup> in the India Today MRDA ranking of Indian Universities (2019).

All the programs offered by Mahatma Gandhi University follow the CSS system with Outcome Based Approach. The flexibility in the curriculum has been designed with industry-specific goals in mind and the educator enjoys complete freedom to appropriate the syllabus by incorporating the latest knowledge and stimulating the creative minds of the students. Bench marked with the course of studies of various institutions of repute, our curriculum is extremely contemporary and is a result of brainstorming efforts of great think-tanks: a large number of faculty members, experts from industries and research level organizations. #### **IMPORTANT POINTS**

- Candidates should register for admissions to Integrated Programmes in science and social science disciplines for the academic year- 2020-21 online on or before the last date stipulated in the admission schedule.
- Online registration can be made by accessing website <a href="cap.mgu.ac.in">cap.mgu.ac.in</a>
- While registering, category (SC/ST or Others) once selected cannot be altered in any further stage of the process.
- Payment can be made through the Integrated Online Payment Gateway.
- The Candidates should not send any document to the University. Verification of documents will be done by the departments concerned at the time of admission.
- Once the initial registration is made, candidate shall note down application number.
- Passwords should never be shared with anyone else.
- Ensure that you are logged out of the portal once you leave the computer.
- Candidates claiming various reservations/bonus marks should upload digital copies of relevant certificates and produce originals of the same during the verification process.
- No memo will be sent by post from this office in any case.
- Verify your personal as well as academic details carefully before final submission.
- Fake registration by any person / institution will be viewed seriously and will be liable for punitive action.
- All candidates who secure allotment should choose the temporary/permanent admission
  option available in the online application after remitting the required fee due to the
  University. Those who fail to do this will be treated as 'Not Joined' and further claim for
  admission by these applicants will not be entertained.
- Candidates who wish to retain their higher options need not remit any tuition fee while
  choosing temporary admission till the second allotment. However such candidates should
  produce all the necessary documents for verification as and when intimated by the
  University.
- Applicants who report for admission at the institute/department concerned (on the date
  intimated by the University in light of the current situation due to Covid -19 Pandemic) with
  the downloaded memo shall make sure that the relevant portion attached thereto is
  properly attested by the institute/department authorities(to be kept by the candidates).
- Candidates will receive SMS at each stage of the allotment. However, the University shall not be liable for non receipt of SMS due to technical snag/delay at mobile service provider's end.
- A candidate shall inevitably choose the temporary admission in the institute/department allotted to him/her in the first instance and if desirous of availing higher options in the institute/department of his/her choice shall not cancel higher options. A candidate who so desires to await his/her chance for admission in an institute/department of his/her choice need not admit himself/herself to any institute/department allotted as per his/her higher options during the course of each allotment and need to finalize his/her choice of institute/department and seek permanent admission only in the third.
- A candidate choosing permanent admission need not cancel his/her higher options as the higher options gets cancelled automatically after choosing permanent admission.
- Students shall not remit any fee other than that prescribed by the University.
- In addition to the general allotment SC/ST candidates will be offered special online allotments.
- In the light of the current situation prevailing in the country due to the Covid 19 pandemic, the applicants need not report at the institute/department for verification of their records except when intimated by the University. The verification of the credentials filled in the online application shall be conducted by the institute/department authorities based on the digital copies of the supporting documents uploaded by the candidates at the time of applying online. The confirmation of admission shall be strictly based on the verification of original documents on a date prescribed by the University after considering the situation due to the contagion.

#### 2. PROGRAMME DETAILS

#### A. Integrated Master of Science Programme

A knowledge centre comprising Sophisticated Instrumentation Facility, instructor-led classroom teaching and technology enhanced learning techniques, first of this kind among the universities in Kerala, namely Institute for Integrated Programmes and Research in Basic Sciences (IIRBS), has been instituted directly under Mahatma Gandhi University in 2008. This academic year, Mahatma Gandhi University is commencing innovative Five Year integrated interdisciplinary Master of Science programmes in five major disciplines at Institute for Integrated Programmes in Basic Sciences (IIRBS). This programmeaims to integrate the conventional bachelors and masters programmes under a specified learning experience by bringing together various science disciplines. The offered disciplines include Chemistry, Physics, Life Sciences, Computer Science and Environmental Science. This five year integrated programme follows a pattern with initial three years of undergraduate (B.Sc.) level Foundation courses followed by two years of Postgraduate (M.Sc.) level Advanced courses. At the end of the programme, Integrated M.Sc. Degree will be awarded in the discipline concerned.

#### Major highlights of the programme:

- The unique inter/multidisciplinary curricular content of this programme enable the students to complete both graduate and post graduate level programmes in a continuous stream and to attain a high level competency in their area of specialization.
- The programme structure is designed in such a way to offer high quality learning environment for students by ensuring intellectual, instrumental as well as experimental support for pursuing excellence in offered disciplines and thereby expected to contribute to the talent pool of researchers and specialized technicians.
- Classes will be handled by the faculty members from the university as well aseminent visiting professors of International/national repute.
- The first four semesters involve a set of comprehensive mandatory/optional courses in all offered science disciplines and mathematics along with a few courses from Humanities, Social Science and Languages (Including foreign).
- Later six semesters are completely devoted for the courses from major discipline.
- Curriculum also consists of hands on training on various advanced instrumentation techniques.
- Curriculum offers opportunities for carrying outproject work/Internship(s) at prestigious academic institutions in India and abroad.

#### 1. Offered Disciplines:

- a) Chemistry (CH)
- b) Physics (PH)
- c) Life Sciences (LS)
- d) Computer Science(CS)
- e) Environmental Science(ES)

- **2. Duration:**The duration of the Integrated M.Sc. programme shall be 5 years (10 Semesters). At the end of the programme a student shall be awarded the Integrated M.Sc. Degree in the discipline concerned.
- 3. Training levels: There are mainly two levels of training,
  - a. **Foundation Level courses**: All 20 students shall be trained in the first six semesters for the foundation level courses which shall be equivalent to the B.Sc. level programmes in their major disciplines.
  - b. **Advanced level courses**: 4 students each from five disciplines shall be trained in the final four semesters for the advanced level courses which shall be equivalent to the M.Sc. level programmes in their major disciplines

#### 4. Programme Over view:

- a. This programme follows 3+2 year pattern with initial six semesters of graduate (B.Sc.)level or Foundation level courses followed by four semesters of Postgraduate (M.Sc.) level or Advanced level courses.
- b. At admission time, students shall be alloted to any one of the five 'Major' disciplines offered based on their merit and option.
- c. However, students shall be allowed to change their major discipline after completion of the first and second semesters, subject to the recommendation from Institute Programme Advisory Committee (IPAC) and approval of the Vice-Chancellor. In such situations, the maximum number of students alloted to a particular discipline (CH/PH/LS/CS/ES) shall not exceed Ten (10) per batch. Suchallotment to a discipline shall be based on the merit of the students, assessed through the combined results of the first and second semester examinations declared in the form of Cumulative Grade Point Average (CGPA) at the end of the first year.
- 5. **Exit option:** Exit option (after UG level courses) is normally not allowed. However students are eligible to get their Undergraduate level degree certificates, after successful completion of six semesters of the programme. This provision shall be availed by students only under special circumstances as convinced by the Institute Programme Advisory Committee and approved by the Vice-Chancellor

#### **B.** Integrated Masters programme in Social Sciences:

The integrated Masters programme in Social Sciences is conceptualized with the aim of setting base for higher-level understanding and research at an early level. The major objective of this programme is to understand social science in its most inclusive sense-as encompassing diverse disciplinary attempts. Such a multidisciplinary programme finds sole in research and training in a diverse set of areas. The multidisciplinary approach will help students from various streams to pursue their studies without much of disciplinary hassles. The programme will be offered by the **Institute for Multidisciplinary Programmes in Social Sciences (IMPSS)** 

#### a. Offered Disciplines:

- i. Economics
- ii. History
- iii. Political Science

#### b. Disciplinary Intersection

The integrated programme will be a delicately balanced intersection of following broader social science disciplines within the framework of multidisciplinary studies:

- a. History
- b. Political Science
- c. Economics/Development Studies
- d. Anthropology
- e. International Relations
- f. Gandhian Studies
- g. Public Policy and Governance
- h. Human Rights

#### **Major Highlights**

**a. Exit Option**: Exit option will be available at the end of three years. Students who exercise 'Exit option' at the end of three-years will be given BA in respective subjects. Students who do not exercise 'Exit option' will be given integrated degree

specifying major at the undergraduate level and the specialization at the Post-Graduate level at the end of five years (eg. B.A in Economics and MA in Economics/Development Studies).

- b. <u>Lateral Entry</u>: The students who have successfully completed bachelors' programmes in the allied fields can be admitted for the masters' programme directly, if there is vacancy and if they fulfil the entry criteria.
- c. <u>Multi-disiplinarity</u>:During the first two years, the students are introduced to a variety of common subjects related to all the major social science disciplines. Fundamental theories and concepts in social sciences will be taught at two different levels.

#### 3. RESERVATION OF SEATS

**Types of Reservation:** Out of the total merit seats available seats will be reserved for different categories under the following main items.

- i. Reservation for International Students
- ii. Reservation for Persons with Disabilities
- iii. Mandatory Reservation
- ii. Reservation for International Students 10% additional seats shall be created over and above the sanctioned strength and added to the total merit seats exclusively for the purpose of accommodating international students. These seats shall not be filled up with other candidates. The students who seek admission in this category should first apply online.
- iii. Reservation for Persons with Disabilities (PD): 5% of the seats are reserved for candidates with disabilities for all programmes. Seats shall be equally reserved for each of the three sections of Persons with Disabilities category (Blind, Deaf and Orthopaedically Challenged) as over and above sanctioned strength and if candidates are not available in a particular category, the seats shall not be filled from any other categories. The selection of candidates under this category will be based on the rank in the inter-se merit list and physical suitability, and not on the basis of the degree of disability.

'Person with disability' means a person suffering from not less than 40% of any disability as certified by a Medical Board constituted for this purpose. Candidates who have a minimum of 40% disability alone will be eligible for this quota. Candidates seeking admission under Differently Abled category should submit the "Certificate of disability", issued not earlier than 5 years prior to the submission of application, by the District Medical Board or bodies of higher status, certifying the degree of percentage of disability. The Permanent Disability Card issued by the State Government is also considered. The permanent disability card has a lifelong validity when issued to a disabled person - above the age of 18 years. For disabled children below 18 years of age, the card is required to be updated once in every five years. Based on the details furnished in the online application, candidates will be provisionally included under the "Differently Abled" category. Candidates seeking admission under PD category should upload with their application form, an attested copy of the 'Certificate of disability' issued by a District Medical Board or bodies of higher status, certifying the degree or percentage of disability.

The selection of candidates under this category will be based on the rank in the inter-se-merit list and not on the basis of the degree of disability.

No reservation of seats is allowed for Blind candidates for Programmes which come under the Faculties of Science/Technology & Applied Sciences.

# 4. CLAIMS FOR MANDATORY RESERVATION AND CERTIFICATES TO BE PRODUCED

Claims for Mandatory Reservations must be made by a candidate at the time of submission of application, with supporting documents as required. The claims for **mandatory** reservation once made in the Application form cannot be altered by the candidate under any circumstances.

Claim for Communal reservation under 'Kerala Socially and Educationally Backward Classes' (KSEBC):- Reservation of seats to the Socially and Educationally Backward Classes will be in accordance with the provisions contained in G.O. (P) 208/66/Edn. dated 2.5.1966, as amended from time to time.

- 1. Candidates belonging to Socially and Educationally Backward Classes as per G.O. (P) 02/2019/BCDD dated 08.03. 2019, who belong to the non-creamy layer are eligible for reservation under this category. The non-creamy layer certificate should have been issued not earlier than 12 months prior to the submission of application. Only the claims of the candidates of those communities that are included in the list of communities appended in the Prospectus will be considered.
- 2. Candidates belonging to Ezhava, Muslim, Other backward Hindus, Latin Catholic other than Anglo Indians and Other backward Christian communities, claiming reservation under SEBC Quota should invariably produce both 'Community' and 'Income Certificates'/non-creamy layer certificate obtained from the Village Officer concerned. The self-attested copy of the above certificates should be attached with the application. Candidates who belong to the non-creamy layer are eligible for reservation. The seats unavailed by SEBC category candidates will be allotted under open quota.

Claims for Reservation under Kerala Scheduled Castes/Scheduled Tribes Quota:-Candidates claiming reservation under Kerala Scheduled Castes/Scheduled Tribes Quota should obtain caste/community certificate from the Village Offices concerned.

Other General Rules for Mandatory Reservation:-The seats unavailed by the SC candidates will go to ST candidates and vice versa. The unavailed seats reserved for SC/ST shall be renotified twice through print media and a special allotment shall be conducted exclusively for filling up vacant seats of SC/ST candidates. If such seats are remaining vacant even after renotification, the unfilled seats shall be filled up from candidates belonging to OEC and in their absence, candidates belonging to SEBC. The seats that further remain unfilled will go to the open quota.

Claim of OEC candidates against the un-availed seats of SC/ST candidates: Other Eligible Community (OEC) candidates who claim allotment to the un-availed seats, if any, under SC/ST quota should furnish community and income certificates/ non-creamy layer certificate obtained from the Village Officer concerned. Those OEC candidates whose annual family income is up to 8 lakhs (Rupees Eight lakhs only) alone are eligible for such seats. They should provide Community Certificate/ non-creamy layer certificate from the Village Officer concerned.

#### 5. ELIGIBILITY FOR ADMISSION

Academic eligibility should be satisfied as on the last date of submission of academic data. In the case of candidates who have passed examinations of other Boards/Institutes/Governments, except KSHEB/CBSE/CISCE, they shall be admitted only if these examinations have been declared equivalent to the qualifying examinations of MG University.

If an applicant for admission is found to have indulged in ragging in the past or if it is noticed later that he/she had indulged in ragging, admissions shall be denied or he/she shall be expelled from the educational institution.

No candidate shall be admitted to the integrated programme unless he/she possess the qualifications and minimum requirements thereof.

#### I. Five Year Integrated Master of Science Programme

#### Offered Disciplines:

- f) Chemistry (CH)
- g) Physics (PH)
- h) Life Sciences (LS)
- i) Computer Science(CS)
- j) Environmental Science(ES)

**Eligibility:** Students who have passed Plus-Two (+2) in Science stream with minimum 60% marks or equivalent grade are eligible for application.

For SC/ST applicants and ST applicants of Lakshadweep, only a pass minimum is required and for SEBC and OEC applicants 3% and 5% relaxation of marks respectively are allowed.

#### II. Integrated Masters Programme in Social Sciences

#### Offered Disciplines:

- (1) Economics
- (2) History
- (3) Political Science

**Eligibility:** Students who have passed Plus-Two in any stream with minimum 60% marks or equivalent grade are eligible for application.

For SC/ST applicants and ST applicants of Lakshadweep, only a pass minimum is required and for SEBC and OEC applicants 3% and 5% relaxation of marks respectively are allowed.

#### 6. PREPARATION OF RANK LIST

The Rank List shall be prepared on the basis of ranking marks arrived at as follows:

Handicap of Five marks for every successive attempt after the first attempt subject to a maximum of twenty marks will be deducted from the total marks in the case of those who have taken two or more chances to complete the examination. The number of chances means the number of chances taken for passing any part of the qualifying examination after the prescribed programme period. Appearance for improvement of marks shall not be considered as an additional chance.

No handicap marks for SAY pass outs be imposed if admitted in the same academic year but five marks shall be deducted if he/she is ranked in the admission list of the succeeding year. Candidates who have passed the qualifying examination under SAY scheme or such supplementary scheme are eligible to apply for First Year programme in the same academic year, but they have to produce the mark lists on or before the closing date of admission as notified by the university.

#### **Resolving of Tie**

If the index marks of more candidates happen to be the same, then for breaking the 'tie', the following criteria shall be followed one after another in the order given below:

- The candidate who has scored higher marks in the concerned elective subject shall be placed senior in the rank list.
- The candidate who has scored higher marks for part iii subjects (or the subjects other than languages, if part is not specified) taken together shall be placed senior in the rank list.
- The candidate who has scored higher marks in part i (English if part is not specified) shall be placed senior in the rank list.
- The candidate who has scored higher marks in part ii (second language if part is not specified) shall be placed senior in the rank list.
- By giving residential weightage (at district/state levels)
- Preference shall be given to candidates who are elder, and the age difference shall be calculated in completed years only, rounding down fractions. (as candidates having difference in age less than one year happen to be admitted in the same class).

#### **Bonus Marks**

The Bonus Marks will be awarded as follows:

- 1. Bonus of 15 marks shall be awarded to applicants with NCC or NSS Certificates at 'Plus Two Level' for admission to all programmes. In respect of NCC candidates, the bonus marks will be awarded on the basis of NCC Certificates signed by the Director and issued by the Directorate of NCC to candidates who have secured al least 75% attendance after having participated in its activities during the programme of study immediately preceding the programme for which admission is sought. An additional bonus mark of 5 to 'B' Certificate holders in proof of their high proficiency.
- 2. In respect of NSS candidates, the bonus marks will be awarded on the basis of NSS Certificates issued by the competent authority.

3. Bonus of 15 marks shall be awarded to the Ex-servicemen applicants and widows and children of Jawans and Ex-servicemen seeking admission to the Degree Programmes. Applicants to this category should invariably produce along with the application form an attested copy of certificate issued not earlier than six months from the last date of submission of application from the military authorities or state/Zilla Sainik Welfare Officer to the effect that he/she is the son/daughter of an ex-service man or an ex service man himself/herself.

The benefit of bonus marks can be scored by a candidate only under one category i.e., either NSS or NCC.

Bonus marks shall be added only if the candidate has obtained the prescribed minimum qualifying marks in the qualifying examination while calculating the index marks.

Handicap Mark/s **shall not be** deemed as marks awarded for physical/mental disability of any kind of the applicant concerned. Handicap mark is the mark deducted from the marks of an applicant on account of acquiring the eligible qualifications in subsequent chances following the regular chance in which he or she ought to have acquired the eligible qualification.

#### **Indexing of Marks**

#### **Integrated Masters programme in Social Sciences**

Total marks obtained in the qualifying examination <u>less</u> handicap marks <u>plus</u> the marks obtained for optional concerned at the qualifying examination <u>plus</u> a subject weightage of 50 marks in the case of those who have taken the subject concerned at the qualifying examination <u>plus</u> bonus marks if any. The subject concerned for the award of 50 marks as weightage will be as indicated below:

History	Weightage of 50 marks for History/Islamic History in the qualifying examination. *
Economics	Weightage of 50 marks for Economics and 25 marks for mathematics. If a candidate has studied both economics and mathematics, weightage for economics alone shall be given.
Political Science	Weightage of 50 marks for Politics/Political Science/Gandhian Studies. *

## **Integrated Master of Science**

All Subjects

Total marks obtained in Part III of the qualifying examination <u>less</u> handicap marks <u>plus</u> marks obtained for the particular subject concerned for which admission is sought <u>plus</u> bonus marks if any. \* In the case of Life Sciences discipline highest mark scored among Biology/Botany/Zoology/Biotechnology/Microbiology shall be added to total of Part III.

\* Marks obtained for the subjects in other streams, viz, CBSE, CISCE etc shall be standardised to that of Kerala Higher Secondary i.e, 200 marks per paper (200marks X 6=1200 i.e., total marks). Index marks shall be calculated as mentioned above, but the marks obtained for vocational subjects in VHSE/THSE, etc. are to be excluded while calculating index marks.

Handicap Mark/s **shall not be** deemed as marks awarded for physical/mental disability of any kind of the applicant concerned. Handicap mark is the mark deducted from the marks of an applicant on account of acquiring the eligible qualifications in subsequent chances following the regular chance in which he or she ought to have acquired the eligible qualification.

#### 7. CENTRALISED ALLOTMENT PROCESS (CAP)

The applicants need submit only a single application form for applying online for admission to both the Integrated programmes for considering them in the Open/Reservation Quota except for **Persons with Disabilities (PD) quota**. If a candidate submits more than one application his/her/her candidature is liable to be cancelled. The candidates seeking admission through PD quota should submit separate online application. The above candidates can also apply under the Centralised Allotment Process, if they are to be considered for general allotment in which case selection will be based on merit/communal quota.

The application fee will be as follows:

#### Remittance of Fee and Submission of Applications

Submission of application i.e. registration of personal and academic data as well as options for programmes and institutes shall be done on-line. Before submitting the application form, candidates are advised to verify the details of academic programmes including hostel facilities through the website of the institute, in addition to the information given in the

prospectus published by the University. Before selecting a programme the applicant shall satisfy himself/herself that he/she possess the prescribed qualification for applying for the programme.

#### **Steps for On-line Registration:**

- 1. For online registration of personal and academic data, the candidates must visit the web site, <a href="https://www.cap.mgu.ac.in">www.cap.mgu.ac.in</a> and click on the link "IP CAP- 2020".
- 2. Follow the online instructions and fill in the personal details in the relevant fields provided.
- 3. Please take utmost care while choosing the board of examination at plus two level and entering the register number as academic details are fetched directly based on the register number entered by the candidate.
- 4. Please note that only one application can be generated using one mobile number and hence the applicant should be extremely careful while entering the details online.
- 5. Create a 'Password'. (The password is mandatory for all future online operations). The password created by the candidate should not be disclosed to others who may misuse it. This may result in tampering with the options and the University will not be responsible for any such eventuality.
- 6. Fill in the Application Form with personal details, academic eligibility and the options correctly.
- 7. Pay the application fee by clicking on the "PAY NOW" button which will redirect you to the Online Payment Gateway. You can use Debit Card/ Credit Card or Internet Banking facility for making online payment.
- 8. After remitting the fee, you will be redirected back to the application page.
- 9. Upload the digital images of the documents in proof of caste/community/bonus marks claimed etc.
- 10. Verify with the relevant documents and confirm the details entered on-line.
- 11. After satisfying himself/herself that the details entered are correct, the applicants shall press the Final Submission Button.
- 12. Take the print out the confirmation page for your future reference.

#### **Special Attention**

After pressing final submission button, further modification of data (except options) is not possible. Hence, make double sure that all entries are made correctly before pressing final submission button. For a complete Illustration refer the appendix.

#### 8. POST ALLOTMENT ACTIVITIES

#### Reporting at the Institute/Department for admission:

It is mandatory that all students who get allotment should report for admission at the Institute/Department concerned after remitting the requisite fee due to University through the Online Payment Gateway. Candidates can download the allotment memo only after remitting the fee due to University through the Online Payment Gateway available in the website. Those who fail to do this will be treated as <a href="Not Joined">Not Joined</a> and further claim for admission by these applicants will not be entertained.

However, considering the current scenario of Covid - 19 Pandemic, candidates are exempted from reporting to the Institute/Department physically. Instead they should contact the Institute/Department to which they are allotted and wish to secure permanent admission and remit the fees to be remitted at the Institute/Department through any of the online mode suggested by the Institute/Department. Those who wish to take temporary admission may do so by availing the option provided in the online application after remitting the requisite fee due to University.

The Institute/Department authorities after verifying the digital copies of the documents provided online in the panel may admit/reject the candidate as the case may be.

However, the candidates should produce the following documents in original before the Head of the *Institute/Department* on any of the suitable dates prescribed for the same after considering the situation prevailing due to Covid -19 contagion.

- 1. The Allotment Memo received online.
- 2. Certificate to prove date of birth.

- 3. Transfer Certificate (TC) from the Institution last attended and Conduct Certificate.
- 4. Marklists of all parts of the Plus Two / equivalent examination.
- 5. Eligibility Certificate from Mahatma Gandhi University, in the case of candidates who have passed their qualifying examination from other Boards/Institutes/governments, except BOARD OF HIGHER SECONDARY EDUCATION Kerala, VHSE Kerala, THSE Kerala, CBSE and CISCE
- 6. Migration Certificate, if applicable.
- 7. Caste certificate in the case of SC/ST candidates. Any other documents required to be produced by the Head of Institution.
- 8. Community Certificate along with non-creamy layer certificate(as per Government rules) from the revenue authorities concerned in the case of SEBC candidates who claim reservation under SEBC category. The non-cramy layer certificate should not have been issued earlier than 12 months prior to the submission of application.
- 9. Community Certificate along with the relevant certificate from the revenue authorities concerned to the effect that they come under the Below Poverty Line (BPL) category of forward communities in the case of candidates who wish to avail of reservation under EWS.
- 10. Candidates who wish to avail of bonus/weightage of marks shall produce the relevant certificates.

The Institute/Department authorities, after verifying the above documents, shall confirm the online admission granted earlier on the basis of digital documents and make necessary updations in the admission portal. The students who get admission in their **first option** should remit the fee applicable to the course in the institution at the time of online admission through any of the online mode specified by the Institute/Department. Those students who decide to **seek permanent** admission by cancelling the higher options also shall remit the tuition fee and confirm their admission.

Institute/Department authorities shall make necessary arrangements to collect fees online to avoid any physical reporting in the current situation of global pandemic. Candidates should not be insisted to report to the Institute in person unless otherwise notified by the University.

Those who retain higher options need not pay any fee in the institution at the time of admission on the basis of the first allotment. However, in the second allotment, they should remit the fee applicable to the programme secured in the higher option and join the Institute/Department., and if not secured they should remit the fee applicable to the programme secured in the previous option. Candidates who wish to retain their higher options need not remit any fee while choosing temporary allotment during first allotment. However, such students should send any of the additional documents required for verification through email if demanded by the the Institute/Department authorities.

The allotted applicants should download the admission memo from the website and produce the same at the time of confirmation of the online admission at the Institute/Department on the dates intimated by the University. The Institute/Department authorities may retain the memo along with other certificates required for the confirmation of admission.

#### **CONFIRMATION OF ALLOTMENT**

As the allotment is based on the information furnished by the candidate online, the eligibility should be confirmed at the time of admission based on the digital copies of the supporting documents uploaded by the candidate. The admission should be done on-line through the panel provided by the University by ensuring the correctness of the candidate details. The Head of the Institute/Department should verify the details furnished in the allotment memo in respect of the candidate by comparing the same with the digital copies of the documents uploaded by the candidate. **Any discrepancy which results in the invalidation of the allotment should be reported to the University and admission should be denied in such cases.** The Head of the institution shall be personally responsible for ensuring the correctness of the relevant details in online application by verifying it with digital records uploaded by the candidate. The Institute/Department authorities shall also verify the genuineness of the digital records by verifying it with the original documents produced by the candidate on the date

specified by the University for the same. The University will also verify the records produced by the candidates who got admission in due course and any discrepancy detected will lead to the cancellation of the allotment.

**Verification of Documents:** - The Head of the Institute shall be personally responsible for verification of digital documents/original documents and satisfaction of the correctness of the records produced by the candidate at the time of seeking admission in the institution. If any discrepancies are noted in the online data and the digital/original records, the allotment will be cancelled. The University will also verify the records produced by the candidates who got admission in due course.

Cancellation of Higher Options after joining a Programme: - Candidates who join a programme on the date specified may cancel their remaining options fully or partially or change the priority of their remaining options before the date specified. A candidate, not interested in any further allotments, must cancel all his/her/her options before the specified date, failing which, the options will remain live and will be considered for further allotments, if any. Alternatively, all higher options gets cancelled automatically if a candidate chooses permanent admission to a particular programme to which he/she is allotted.

A candidate need not report for admission in the institution allotted to him/her in the first instance and if desirous of availing higher options in the college of his/her choice shall not cancel higher options. A candidate who so desires to await his/her chance for admission in a college of his/her choice need not admit himself/herself to any programme allotted as per his/her higher options during the course of each allotment and need to finalize his/her choice of college and seek permanent admission only in the second allotment.

Applicants can avail the option available in the online application to choose temporary/permanent admission if he/she is allotted to any of the options other than first option. If a candidate is allotted to his/her first option, he/she will not have the option to take temporary admission.

As indicated earlier, allotted candidates can exercise online option on the mode of admission after the publication of allotment/s and need not report to the Institute for the physical verification of records. They may remit the fee due to the Institute including tuition fee through any of the online modes of remittance.

Candidates shall be intimated to report the Institute by the University after assessing the situation prevailing due to the Covid -19 virus contagion.

#### Receipt regarding entry in the Online Admission Portal:

The Institute authorities should provide a receipt that can be downloaded from the Online Admission Portal which states that necessary entries in respect of the reported candidate have been made in the Online Admission Portal and the candidate choosing a mode of admission shall download the same from the online application without fail. The candidates shall ensure that the Institute have verified their digital documents/records and have admitted them temporarily/permanently. An option in this regard shall be available in the candidate login from where he/she may choose permanent/temporary admission and download receipt in respect of confirmation of temporary /permanent admission by the Institute.

#### 9. SEAT ALLOTMENT PROTOCOL

**Admission & Allotment in Programmes**: Allotment of seats will be institution wise/programme wise.

Allotment in Institute/Department to Candidates with multiple claims under Mandatory Quota: All candidates included in the Rank lists are eligible for allotment under State Merit (SM). Candidates might be entitled for other reservation quotas also under Mandatory Reservation. For example, a candidate may have the benefit of SEBC reservation (EZ/MU/OBH/LC/OBX) or Scheduled Caste (SC) or Scheduled Tribe (ST) claim. The seats will be offered on the hierarchy of quotas.

The hierarchy in order is as follows:

- State Merit (SM) All candidates included in the Rank Lists are eligible for allotment under State Merit.
- Communal Reservation (SEBC/SC/ST).
- A candidate without SEBC/SC/ST reservation benefit will be considered only against the 'State Merit' seats wherever available at the time of allotment.

#### 10. FEE

Fee for the various integrated programmes for the admission to 2020-21 batch will be available in the University website. If a candidate remits the fee due to the University on securing allotment and reports to the Institute allotted and subsequently secures allotment to another programme due to higher option, he/she need not remit the fee again.

The prescribed fee due to the University as detailed below will have to be remitted by candidates (except SC/ST candidates) through the online payment gateway available in the CAP website as per the time schedule prescribed. The receipt generated should be retained by the candidate so as to produce the same before the institute authorities at the time of admission.
